AREA CLOSURE

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and Title 36 CFR 261.50(a), the following acts are prohibited in the area described in this order, and as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A, all within the Safford Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Graham County, Arizona:

- 1. Entering or using the northern portion of the Galiuros Mountains north of Sunset Peak and Kielberg Peak. 36 CFR 261.52(e).**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation in the area, including permittees.

AREA DESCRIBED:

Galiuro Mountains: The southern line of the closure area begins at the Forest boundary on High Creek Road (FR 159) at T10S, R21E, Sec. 17, SE and following this road to the High Creek Trail and thence west to Sunset Peak. From Sunset Peak continuing west to Kielberg Peak and the Forest boundary at T10S, R19E, Sec 9, SW. The closed area is all Forest System lands north of this line.

PURPOSE:

To protect the public from hazards associated with the Oak Fire.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order shall be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until July 30, 2014, unless rescinded earlier.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this order.

3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations, and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].
