Tenaya Fire Trail Closure Rescinded

Most burning areas and hazards from the 415 acre Tenaya wildfire discovered on September 7, 2015 have been mitigated and firefighters are continuing to secure the fire perimeter.

By order of the Superintendent of Yosemite National Park and under authority of Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 1.5(a) and Section (a)(1), the following areas closed due to the wildfire will be reopened on Tuesday, September 15, 2015 at 1000 hours:

- The area south of the Tioga Road between Porcupine Flat to Olmsted Point.
- The Snow Creek Trail from Olmsted Point to the 6,000 foot elevation mark to the east.
- Following the 6,000 foot elevation contour west until it reaches Yosemite Creek Trail.
- The Yosemite Creek Trail to the west.
- From the Yosemite Creek Trail along the old Tioga Road to Porcupine Flat.
- The Snow Creek Trail.

Hikers and trail users are urged to exercise caution in the fire area due to smoky conditions, uneven terrain, fire weakened trees and logs, rolling debris and isolated hot areas of the fire near the Lehamite and North Rim trails.
