

IDAHO PANHANDLE NATIONAL FORESTS

BONNERS FERRY DISTRICT ROAD AND TRAIL CLOSURE

Order No. D7-11-001

National Forest Systems Roads

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter II, part 261, Subpart B, Section 261.50(b), the following act is prohibited on the National Forest System lands within the Bonners Ferry Ranger District of the Idaho Panhandle National Forests.

Entering or being in the areas described below (36 CFR 261.53(e)):

The 281 road Sections 11, 14, 15, 22, 21, 28, T64N, R3W, B.M.

The entire length of Trails 21 starting at West Fork trailhead, Section 28, T64N, R3W, B.M. to Section 20, T64N, R3W, B.M. and the junction with Trail 102.

The entire length of Trail 347 starting at trail 21, Section 28, T64N, R3W, B.M. to its termination at Westfork Mountain, Section 9, T63N, R3W, B.M.

The 2545 road at the junction with Road 655, Section 3, T64N, R3W, B.M.

The entire length of Trail 102 starting at Hidden Lake trailhead, Section 17, T64N, R3W, B.M. to its termination at Road 281, Section 11, T64N, R93W, B.M.

The 2443 road at the junction with Road 281, Section 1, T64N, R3W, B.M.

The entire length of Trail 17 starting at the trailhead on road 2443, T64N, R2W, B.M.

The entire length of Trail 18 starting at Cutoff Peak, T64N, R3W, B.M. and ending at Smith Triangulation T64N, R2E, B.M.

This restriction is in addition to those stated in Subpart A, 36 Code of Federal Regulations Part 261 and becomes effective immediately and will remain in effect until rescinded or revoked.

This restriction is necessary for the protection of public health and safety due to fire activity in the area.


EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authoring the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

2. Any Federal, State, or local Law Enforcement Officer or members of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).
