

Within burned areas, be alert to a number of potential hazards created by recent fire activity. These include falling snags or trees, rolling material such as rocks or logs, holes from burned out stumps and roots, and others. Wind may increase the hazards. Although open, not all trails have been cleared, and many may be impassable, or may become so due to weather events.

PLEASE REMEMBER: Chainsaws are prohibited within the wilderness areas!


