Delintment lake began as a beaver dam on a 160-acre tract of land patented by F. W. De Lintient, on July 23, 1891. The land passed through several hands and eventually sold to the U.S. Forest Service in 1940. Local citizens, loggers, ranchers, and Forest Service employees constructed the existing dam that forms the lake. A partnership project between the Oregon National Guard, 1249<sup>th</sup> Engineering Battalion, and the Ochoco National Forest constructed a handicap access ramp and dock in 1991.
