

## Berry Fire

**Reported** July 25, 2016- Lightning caused  
**Current Size** 14,551 acres (Sept. 7, 2016)  
**Fuel Types** Mature Spruce-Fir Forest  
**Location** Elk Ridge between Owl and Berry Creek Trails

**Status of Fire:** Firefighters are monitoring the fire and protecting park assets. Management objectives include ensuring firefighter and public safety and allowing for natural processes. In this recommended wilderness, natural fires are allowed to burn to fulfill their role in the ecosystem.

**Updates:** Grassy Lake Road through the entire Parkway is open to through travel. Foot travel is allowed no more than 100 feet from Grassy Lake Road and the Grassy Lake Road Camp 4 access road.

**See complete updated closures.** In the John D. Rockefeller Jr. Memorial Parkway, lands and waters are closed:

- South of the Grassy Lake Road from the western boundary of the Parkway easterly to Grassy Lake Camp 4;
- East and south of the eastern high water mark of the Snake River;
- In the Snake River, its tributaries, and adjacent lands downstream of Grassy Lake Road Camp 4.
