**FIRE CLOSURE
Burroughs Fire Area**

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551, and Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), Section 261.50 (a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands within the Burroughs Fire Area on the Shoshone National Forest, Fremont County, Wyoming (the "Restricted Area") and on all roads and trails located with the Restricted Area ("Restricted Roads and Trails"). The Restricted Area and Restricted Roads and Trails are depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

The Restricted Area is further defined as that area bounded on the west by Forest Road 511, on the north by the Washakie Wilderness boundary, on the east by Forest Road 285, and on the south by Forest Road 285.

The purpose of this Order is to protect human life and public safety due to the impacts of the wildland fire.

PROHIBITIONS:


1. Going into or being upon the Restricted Area. **36 CFR 261.52(e) and 36 CFR 261.53(e).**
2. Being on the Restricted Roads. **36 CFR 61.54(e).**
3. Being on the Restricted Trails. **36 CFR 61.55(a).**

EXEMPTIONS: Pursuant to **36 CFR 261.50(e)** the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing otherwise prohibited act or omission.

This order becomes effective at 1800 on August 31, 2013, and remains in effect until rescinded, or through November 1, 2013, whichever occurs first.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for a legal entity other than an individual, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551, and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).
