TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551 and 36 C.F.R 261.50 (b), the following acts are prohibited within the “restricted area” of the Douglas Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Cochise County, Arizona, as described in this Order, and as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

1. Being on National Forest System Roads 314 and 685. **36 CFR 261.54(e)**

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

RESTRICTED AREA:

The “restricted area” is defined as National Forest System Roads 314 and 685 located in Township 19 South, Range 31 East and is confined to Sections 7, 9, 10, 13, 14, 15, 18, 20, 21 and 22. This closure affects 10 miles of road in the Chiricahua Mountains.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this order is to allow for public safety in the Chiricahua Mountains after recent flood events have caused significant road damage and erosion.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until September 22, 2015, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.
2. This Order supersedes, rescinds, and replaces any previous orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order.
3. Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for individuals and \$10,000.00 for organizations and/or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months. [Title 16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].
