OVERVIEW

- The lightning ignited Fulton Fire started September 12, 2016 along the Mogollon Rim near the Mogollon Rim Visitor's Center. Fire officials are fully suppressing this fire to help protect local communities, powerlines, recreation sites, travel corridors, wildlife habitat, timber sales and other natural resources.

HAZARDS

- Shallow root systems have burned and standing dead trees (snags) as well as trees that appear healthy may fall, especially in high winds.
- **Walking through blackened areas is not safe for anyone, including pets.** White ash may indicate deep pockets of heat where roots and ground vegetation continues to burn below ground level.
- Firefighters and equipment remains in the area. Use caution when driving and keep lights on at all times. Emergency equipment has right of way—delays in the fire area may be possible.

ACTIVE FIRE

- The Fulton Fire will continue to burn within the perimeter of established control lines until we receive significant, repeated precipitation.
- Flames will be more noticeable at night.
- Firefighters will continue to monitor and patrol for hot spots.

REPORT to 911

Report anything that is an imminent threat to life or property. Does it appear to be growing in intensity?

DO NOT REPORT

Expect to see smoke and small flames within control lines as the fire burns pockets of unburned fuels within the fire's perimeter.
