


Projected Smoke Impacts: Fulton Fire (24 hour AQI – PM2.5)

Forecast valid for Monday, September 26th to Tuesday, September 27th, 2016.

Fulton Fire: Currently at 2,860 acres, 65% contained

Northeasterly winds are expected to slow and weaken today and a slow moving low pressure system is expected to bring moisture tonight and tomorrow. Fire activity is expected to slow with firing operations concluding after today. Smoke will move west through today and tomorrow, with potential light smoke in Payson, Kohl's Ranch, Tonto Basin, Camp Verde, and Sedona later tonight. Travelers should continue to pay close attention to road signs as smoke may be present over I17, HWY260 and other local roads especially in the early evening. Heavier pockets of fuel may continue to produce small amounts of smoke over the coming weeks, but large smoke events are not expected. This will be the final Air Quality Forecast for the Fulton Fire.
