


Six Mandatory Evacuation orders went out 8/16/2016. Messages and maps below.


West Cajon Valley:

This is the San Bernardino County Sheriff Department with an urgent message on Tuesday August 16. There is a fire affecting your area of West Cajon Valley and you are under Mandatory Evacuation Orders. Highway 15 to Highway 2 residents are to immediately evacuate using Highway 138 north.




Lytle Creek:

This is the San Bernardino county sheriff department, there is a fire affecting your area. You are now subject to mandatory evacuation order. Use Lytle creek blvd south and out of the area. Please listen to your local radio station for additional info. There is a shelter in place at Jessie Turner Center 15556 Summit, Fontana Devore animal shelter is accepting animals.




West Oak Hills:

This is the San Bernardino county sheriff department. There is a fire affecting your area. You are now subject to mandatory evacuation order. To evacuate Travel north on 395. North on baldy mesa. North on Johnson or north on sheep creek to leave the area. Evac center is sultana high school. 17311 Sultana in Hesperia. Animals can be taken to Victorville fairgrounds.




Wrightwood:

There is a fire affecting your area. You are now subject to a mandatory evacuation order of Wrightwood. West Highway 138 West on Highway 2.



Phelan:

This is the San Bernardino county sheriff department, there is a fire affecting your area. You are now subject to mandatory evacuation order. Exit north to bear valley and go east or west bound. Evacuation center is sultana high school. 1 7 3 1 1 Sultana in Hesperia. Animals can be taken to Victorville fairgrounds.



East Oak Hills:

This is the San Bernardino county sheriff department. There is a fire affecting your area. You are now subject to a mandatory evacuation order. Take the 1 73 to Hesperia or the 1 38 to the mountains. EVACUATE TO THE EAST. Evacuation center is Sultana high school. 1 7 3 1 1 Sultana in Hesperia. Animals can be taken to Victorville fairgrounds.
