

ORDER NO. 14-05-751
KLAMATH NATIONAL FOREST
EMERGENCY CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Klamath National Forest. This Order is effective from August 16, 2014, until the Log and Man Fires are declared out.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Log and Man Fire Closure Area. The boundary of the Log and Man Fire Closure Area begins at the intersection of the Shelly Fork Trail (Forest Trail No. 5527) and the boundary of the Klamath National Forest; then continues northerly along the National Forest boundary to its intersection with the Marble Mountain Wilderness boundary; then continues westerly along the Marble Mountain Wilderness boundary to its intersection with the Rye Patch (Paradise Lake) Trail (Forest Trail No. 5560); then continues westerly along the Rye Patch (Paradise Lake) Trail (Forest Trail No. 5560) to its intersection with the Pacific Crest Trail (Forest Trail No. 2000); then continues southerly along the Pacific Crest Trail (Forest Trail No. 2000) to its intersection with the Haypress Trail (Forest Trail No. 5557); then continues westerly along the Haypress Trail (Forest Trail No. 5557) to its intersection with the Wooley Creek Trail (Forest Trail No. 5558); then continues southerly along the Wooley Creek Trail (Forest Trail No. 5558) to its intersection with the Salmon and Scott River Ranger District boundary; then continues easterly along the Salmon and Scott River Ranger District boundary to its intersection with the Pacific Crest Trail (Forest Trail No. 2000); then continues southeasterly along the Pacific Crest Trail (Forest Trail No. 2000) to its intersection with the Shelly Fork Trail (Forest Trail No. 5527); then continues easterly along the Shelly Fork Trail (Forest Trail No. 5527) back to the starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.53(e).
2. Being on any National Forest System trail in the Log and Man Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(a).
3. Being on Shackleford Road (Forest Road No. 43N21) from mile marker one then west to its terminus, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.54(e).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Owners or lessees of private land in the area to the extent necessary to gain access to their land.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.


