Happy Camp Complex Final Evening Update Thursday, September 18, 2014

Current Information:

Fire activity today was minimal. Crews continued to mop up the northern areas of the fire. Most of the fire activity is in the Marble Mountain Wilderness. Firefighters and Resource Advisors will continue to focus on suppression repair. Suppression repair mitigates damage to soil, water and roads damaged by fire suppression activity.

The increase in total acreage is due to the Man Fire coming under the management of the Happy Camp Complex, which includes 15 total fires.

Firefighters and equipment from the Happy Camp Complex were mobilized to assist today on two new fires. Air resources were used to support the new fires as well. One was near Orleans on the Six Rivers NF, and the other on the Shasta Trinity NF.

Evacuations and Road Closures:

Effective 9:00 a.m. September 17, the Siskiyou County Sheriff's Office lifted all mandatory evacuations, advisory evacuations, and road closures associated with the Happy Camp Complex. Fire crews and equipment are still working in these areas. Drivers in the area are reminded to use caution and reduce speeds when driving on Scott River Road and the vicinity. Rainfall could loosen stones and other debris, which could roll into the roadway.

Forest Closures and Restrictions:
