

ORDER NO. 05-07-54-16-14
REY FIRE CLOSURE
LOS PADRES NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited on the Santa Barbara Ranger District within the Los Padres National Forest. This Order is effective from August 26, 2016 through December 1, 2016.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System lands within the Rey Fire Closure Area described in Exhibit A and shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.52(e).
2. Being on any National Forest System road within the Rey Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.54(e).
3. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Rey Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(a).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a permit from Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.

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EXHIBIT A

The boundary of the Rey Fire Closure Area begins at the intersection of the Santa Ynez River and the Forest boundary, then continues east along the Santa Ynez River to its intersection with Potrero Seco Road, then continues north along Potrero Seco Road to its intersection with Don Victor Valley Fire Road, then continues northeast along Don Victor Valley Fire Road to its intersection with Jacinto Reyes Scenic Byway, then continues north along Jacinto Reyes Scenic Byway to its intersection with CA State Hwy 33, then continues west along CA State Hwy 33 to its intersection with Forest Road No. 7N04, then continues northwest along Forest Road No. 7N04 to its intersection with the gate at Tinta Trailhead, then continues west along Tinta Trail to its intersection with the gate at Forest Road No. 8N19, then continues west along Forest Road No. 8N19 to its intersection with Forest Road No. 9N11, then continues northeast along Forest Road 9N11 to its intersection with Forest Road No. 32S13, then continues northeast along Forest Road No. 32S13 to its intersection with Forest Road No. 8N09, then continues south along Forest Road No. 8N09 to its intersection with Forest Road No. 7N07, then continues south along Forest Road No. 7N07 to its intersection with the Forest boundary, then continues southeast along the Forest boundary back to the starting point.
