

ORDER NO. 14-11

SEQUOIA NATIONAL FOREST
KERN RIVER RANGER DISTRICT
SHIRLEY FIRE
NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROADS CLOSURES

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(b), and to provide for public safety, the following act is prohibited within the Kern River Ranger District of the Sequoia National Forest. This Order is effective from June 14, 2014 through June 30, 2014.

Being on the National Forest System roads listed below and shown on the attached map.

- a. Rancheria Road (Forest Road No. 25S15) from its intersection with Highway 155 then south approximately eight miles to its intersection with Sawmill Road (Forest Road No. 25S03).
- b. Wagy Flat Road (Forest Road No. 25S02) from its intersection with Old State Road (County Road 114), then south for approximately three miles to the forest boundary in Section 10, Township 26 South, Range 32 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.
- c. Sawmill Road (Forest Road No. 26S03) from its intersection with Rancheria Road then east for approximately six miles to the forest boundary in Section 16, Township 26 South, Range 32 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.
- d. Alder Creek Road (Forest Road No. 25S04) from Alder Creek Campground then south and east for approximately eight miles to its intersection Rancheria Road.


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
3. Residents in the area.
4. Owners or lessees of land in the area.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both.
16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
