

# Repopulation Plan for the Ruth Lake Area

Mad River Complex CA-SRF-001433

California Interagency Incident Management Team 5- IC Minton

August 14, 2015

Fire crews are continuing to extinguish wildland fires, identify and reduce fire incident hazards in and around the Mad River Complex that include the Pickett, Gobbler and Lassic Fires.

The Road Blocks and Evacuations will be lifted in the affected areas on:

- Saturday, August 15, 2015 at 08:00 am
  - Van Duzen Road
  - Lower Mad River Road for the Ruth area

Road and Fire Area Closures remaining in effect until further notice:

- Pickett Fire continues to burn northeast towards the Forest Glen area along Highway 36. Hazards still include active Wildland Fire, Falling Trees, Heavy Fire Equipment.
  - The following roads will continue to be closed:
    - Highway 36
      - From the South Fork Mountain Summit (mile marker 9.29) to East of Forest Glen area.
    - Forest Service Route 23 Road
      - From Highway 36 to Cedar Gap
    - Forest Service 2S02 Road
      - From Forest Service 2S54 Road to Forest Service Route 23
    - All Forest Service campgrounds within the fire closure area will remain closed until further notice.

- Lassic Fire continues to burn southwest into the Mount Lassic Wilderness and spread north into the Blanket Creek with threat to homes in the Swayback Ridge area. Hazards still include active Wildland Fire, Falling Trees, Heavy Fire Equipment.
  - The following roads will continue to be closed:
    - Forest Service Roads 1S07, 1S08, 1S11, 2S08 and 1S23
      - From Van Duzen Road to all areas leading to the Mount Lassic Wilderness
