Meadow Creek Fire Update July 19, 2010 (1200 noon)

Smoke can be expected to settle into low-lying valleys overnight and early morning.

Today crews on the Meadow Creek Fire continue to work the fire's edge where it is safe to do so. Over time the fire is expected to continue moving north and northeast.



The Meadow Creek Fire on July 18 burning on the northeast rim of Main Elk Creek off the north end of Hadley Point.

As of this morning, Steve Gage's National Incident Management Organization is assisting the Upper Colorado Interagency Fire on the Meadow Creek fire. Yesterday evening the fire grew about 200 acres, most of it along the northeast rim of Main Elk Creek Canyon.
