Facts at a Glance

Size: 64,150 total acres

A cold front will be moving through the area on Friday bringing with it a chance of thunderstorms and high winds. Firefighters are taking advantage of the lower temperatures, higher humidity, and lighter winds to reinforce fire lines before Friday.

Lawyer 2 Fire – Kamiah, Idaho (44,100 acres)

Firefighters worked toward mopping up 100 feet in from the perimeter. Patrol operations continued today in all areas of the fire. U.S. Highway 12 remains open to all traffic but may periodically have a pilot car moving traffic through the fire area north of Kamiah.

Lolo 2 Fire – Between Weippe and Woodland, Idaho (3,500 acres)

Firefighters worked along the edge of the fire strengthening firelines constructed by private citizens. Crews continued strengthening lines behind houses in the Cottonwood Flats area and north of Caribel Road, while efforts in the southeast edge of the fire focus on reinforcing firelines behind houses east of Kamiah.

Carrot Ridge Fire – Northeast of Pardee, Idaho (acres of this fire are included in the Lawyer 2)

The fire made runs into the Texas Creek canyon and Schmidt Creek canyon area. Retardant was used to slow the fire's progress.

Fisher Fire – approximately seven miles north of Craigmont, Idaho (21,640 acres)

Today, crews continued improving and holding existing fireline, mopping up hotspots (particularly in heavily-forested areas along Six Mile and Big Canyons, and continued to patrol other containment lines.

Syringa Fires – Northeast of Syringa, Idaho

This includes the Motorway, Woodrat (2600 acres), Big Hill, and Four Bit Fires. The Woodrat Fire is staffed with firefighters and equipment and line construction around the perimeter has begun.
