Fire Recovery Update & Grass Seeding Forestland After Fire

This “After the Fire” program is designed to give private landowners affected by the 2015 fires an update on what has been accomplished so far regarding post-fire assessment and recovery as well as information regarding grass seeding their burned forestlands.

The fire assessment and recovery update will cover important hazards that have been documented such as areas at high probability for mass wasting and erosion, and what resources (if any) have been made available or are forthcoming to help finance fire recovery.

The pros and cons of grass seeding forestlands after fire will also be presented, along with where grass seeding is likely to be most effective, and what grass seed mixtures are best for the various sites in the local area.
