The fire and surrounding area is receiving significant amounts of rain. All resources are currently being demobilized. Due to rain and road conditions the fire is unstaffed today. The fire will be turned over to local DNRC Helena Unit in the morning.

The DNRC County Assist Team would like to thank the stakeholders, residents, public and local government for their support and partnership. A special thank you also goes to the firefighters who worked hard on this fire. Your efforts in initial attack and through the duration of the fire are greatly appreciated.

The Incident Commander and Sheriff's Office have lifted the evacuation and closure orders. Residents and recreationalists are allowed back in the area. Beartooth Road, Holter Lake Campground, Log Gulch Campground, Departure Point Campground, Beartooth Wildlife Management Area and Holter Lake are all open.

The Bray Fire and Timber Hills Fires were reported Sunday afternoon. The Bray Fire is 5 miles E of Wolf Creek, MT. The Timber Hills Fire is near Craig, MT, approximately 5 acres and 100% contained. Both fires are in steep rugged terrain with the primary vegetation being timber and grass.

Cooperating agencies include the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation, Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Fish Wildlife & Parks (FWP), Lewis and Clark County, Wolf Creek/Craig Volunteer Fire Service Area, Lewis and Clark County Sheriff's Office and Montana Highway Patrol.
