Current Situation

Today's Activities: Crews will continue to build and improve lines, extinguish hot spots and mop-up.

Weather: Today, cool weather and rain are predicted with northeast winds.

Closures: Rattlesnake Gulch Road is closed. Montana Fish, Wildlife, & Parks has issued closures for the following areas: Canyon Creek Wildlife Management Area and the Sieben Block Management Area.

Overview: The predicted rain over the fire area is expected to assist with the fire-fighting efforts but it isn't expected to extinguish the fire entirely. Crews expect to continue mop-up activities for at least the next two days. The Department of Natural Resources & Conservation (DNRC) County Assist Team, Incident Commander David Hamilton, assumed command of fire Friday morning. The team is implementing a full suppression strategy to put the fire out as safely and quickly as possible.

Safety Message: Please use extra caution on Lincoln Road (Hwy 279) as fire traffic will be entering and exiting the area. It is important not to stop or block roadways.
