

**TEMPORARY AREA AND USE RESTRICTIONS
FOREST SERVICE SYSTEM ROADS AND TRAILS**

OCHOCO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC, Title 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following special restrictions and prohibitions are established on all Forest Roads, trails within the specific area on the Ochoco National Forest, Lookout Mountain Ranger District, in the State of Oregon where signed on the ground and contained within the boundary lines described as follows and depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated in this Order as 'ATTACHMENT A.'

- Beginning at the intersection of the north boundary of the Ochoco National Forest and Forest Road 2730-550, thence easterly in a clockwise direction along the north boundary of the Ochoco National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 2630-450 at the north-western edge of the Bridge Creek Wilderness, thence south-westerly along Forest Road 2630-450 to its intersection with Forest Road 2630, thence easterly along Forest Road 2630 to its intersection with Forest Road 2230, thence south along Forest Road 2230 to its intersection with Forest Road 22, thence easterly along Forest Road 22 to its intersection with Forest Road 22-150, thence easterly along Forest Road 22-150 to its intersection with Forest Road 3010, thence southerly along Forest Road 3010 to its intersection with Forest Road 30, thence south along Forest Road 30 to its intersection with Forest Road 42, thence easterly along Forest Road 42 to its intersection with Forest Road 4280, thence southerly along Forest Road 4280 to its intersection with Forest Road 4260, thence westerly along Forest Road 4260 to its intersection with the south boundary of the Ochoco National Forest, thence westerly along the south boundary of the Ochoco National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 22 at the Ochoco Ranger Station, thence north-easterly along Forest Road 22 to its intersection with Forest Road 2210, thence northerly along Forest Road 2210 to its intersection with Forest Road 2630, thence north-west along Forest Road 2630 to its intersection with Highway 26, thence northerly along Highway 26 to its intersection with Forest Road 27, thence northerly along Forest Road 27 to its intersection with Forest Road 2730, thence northerly along Forest Road 2730 to its intersection with Forest Road 2730-550, thence northerly along Forest Road 2730-550 to the beginning.

PROHIBITIONS

It is prohibited to go into or be upon any of the above described lands which are closed for the protection of public health and safety, including all National Forest System roads and trails therein. 36 CFR § 261.53(e)

Being on a forest system road. 36 CFR § 261.54(e)

Being on a forest system trail. 36 CFR § 261.55(a)

This restriction is in addition to those prohibitions enumerated in Subpart A of 36 CFR§261 and any other special restrictions pertaining to the described lands.

EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR§261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Personnel with written authorization by a Forest Officer, which specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act. The issuing Officer may include such conditions as are considered necessary for the protection of the area, or for the promotion of the health, safety, or welfare of its users.
2. Any Federal, State, or local Officer or volunteer in the performance of an official duty.
3. Persons under a special use authorization that allows the otherwise prohibited action, and approved contractors and their agents directly engaged in approved work outlined in an operating plan or permit.
4. Persons or their invitees who live or own property within the closure area, and permittees who have a legitimate need to access their permitted allotment, escorted or approved by IMT.
5. Persons travelling along portions of Forest Roads 22, 2630, 2230, 22-150, 3010, 30, and affected portions of Highway 22, shown as open on Attachment A, providing those persons do not depart from the open roads into the closure area.
6. Those persons camping at Walton Lake Campground and Allen Creek Horse Camp, which shall remain open, providing those persons do not depart from the open roads and open campgrounds into the closure area.

'Person' means natural person, corporation, company, partnership, trust, firm, or association of persons. 'Permit' means authorization in writing by a Forest Officer. 'Forest Officer' means an employee of the Forest Service.

This closure is enacted due to firefighting activities taking place within the closure area, and for the protection of public and employee safety.

This order replaces Order Number 06-07-01-14-001-02, which is hereby rescinded. This Order becomes effective at 08:00 AM, July 25, 2014, and will remain in force until rescinded.

VIOLETION OF THESE PROHIBITIONS IS PUNISHABLE AS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR, BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$5,000 FOR AN INDIVIDUAL OR \$10,000 FOR A LEGAL ENTITY OTHER THAN AN INDIVIDUAL, OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN SIX (6) MONTHS, OR BOTH. TITLE 16 USC, SECTION 551; TITLE 18 USC, SECTION 3551.
