The first Ranger District headquarters was constructed here in 1911 by E. W. Donnelly, District Ranger. The one-room pine log cabin still stands today. This facility served as the Ranger Station until 1952 and is now used as a work center for fire crews. The old original Allison Ranger Station was accepted on the National Register of Historical places in 1979.
