ORDER No. 06-15-03-15-338

EMERGENCY AREA CLOSURE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY

Diamond Lake Ranger District

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(a) and (b), the following act is prohibited within the Diamond Lake Ranger District as described below and shown on the map attached as Exhibit A, located within the Umpqua National Forest from August 12, 2015 until October 31, 2015, unless rescinded sooner.

1. Public health and safety [36 CFR § 261.53(e)]
2. Going into or being upon an area [36 CFR § 261.52(e)]
3. Being on a trail closed for public health and safety [36 CFR § 261.55(a)]
 - a. Silent Creek Trail 1479
 - b. Horse & Teal Lake 1481
 - c. Mount Bailey Trail 1451
4. Entering or using a developed recreation site or a portion thereof [36 CFR § 261.58(b)]
 - a. Hemlock Cabin
 - b. Mt. Bailey Trailhead
 - c. Silent Creek Trailhead
 - d. Mt. Thielsen Viewpoint
5. Being on a road closed for public health and safety [36 CFR § 261.54(e)]
 - a. 3703 380
 - b. 3703 300
 - c. 6530 760
 - d. 6530 100

Area Closures is as follows:

The area closure includes all roads and trails within the closed area and roads and trails described above and below and as shown on Exhibit A:

Beginning at the intersection of Highway 138 and the North Entrance Road to Crater Lake National Park heading north along the Highway 138 to the intersection of Highway 138 and Highway 230, continuing southwest on Highway 230 to the Rogue River Siskiyou/Umpqua National Forest boundary, continuing southeast along the Rogue River Siskiyou/Umpqua NF boundary to the boundary of Crater Lake National Park, continuing west on the Crater Lake National Park/Umpqua National Forest boundary back to the intersection of Highway 138 and the North Entrance Road to Crater Lake National Park. Road closures include the entire length of 3703 380 and 3703 300; and the portions of 6530 760 and 6530 100 that are within the Umpqua National Forest as shown on Exhibit A.

State Highway 138 and 230 are under the jurisdiction of the the Oregon Department of Transportation and are not closed pursuant to this order.

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.52(e), the following people are exempt from this order:

1. Any Federal, State or local Officer or member on an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

2. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in Title 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization or imprisonment for not more than 6 months or both. 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§3559 and 3571.


