

**TEMPORARY AREA AND USE RESTRICTIONS
FOREST SERVICE SYSTEM ROADS AND TRAILS**

OCHOCO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC, Title 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following special restrictions and prohibitions are established on all Forest Roads, trails within the specific area on the Ochoco National Forest, Lookout Mountain Ranger District, in the State of Oregon where signed on the ground and contained within the boundary lines described as follows and depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated in this Order as 'ATTACHMENT A.'

- Beginning at the intersection of the north boundary of the Ochoco National Forest and Bear Creek, thence easterly in a clockwise direction along the north boundary of the Ochoco National Forest to its intersection with Forest Road 12, thence south along Forest Road 12 to its intersection with Forest Road 42 (*Six Corners*) thence south along Forest Road 42 to its intersection with the south boundary of the Ochoco National Forest, thence westerly along the south boundary of the Ochoco National Forest to its intersection with Highway 26, thence north-easterly along Highway 26 to its intersection with Buck Creek, thence westerly along Buck Creek to its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of the Mill Creek Wilderness, thence proceeding in a counter-clockwise direction along the Mill Creek Wilderness boundary to its closest proximity to the intersection of Forest Road 27 and Forest Road 2730-250 at Grant Springs, thence north-westerly along Forest Road 2730-250 to its intersection with Forest Road 2735, thence northerly along Forest Road 2735 to its intersection with Bear Creek at Cougar West Trailhead, thence north-easterly along Bear Creek to the beginning.

PROHIBITIONS

It is prohibited to go into or be upon any of the above described lands which are closed for the protection of public health and safety, including all National Forest System roads and trails therein. 36 CFR § 261.53(e)

Being on a forest system road. 36 CFR § 261.54(e)

Being on a forest system trail. 36 CFR § 261.55(a)

This restriction is in addition to those prohibitions enumerated in Subpart A of 36 CFR§261 and any other special restrictions pertaining to the described lands.

EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR§261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:


1. Personnel with written authorization by a Forest Officer, which specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act. The issuing Officer may include such conditions as are considered necessary for the protection of the area, or for the promotion of the health, safety, or welfare of its users.

2. Any Federal, State, or local Officer or volunteer in the performance of an official duty.
3. Persons under a special use authorization that allows the otherwise prohibited action, and approved contractors and their agents directly engaged in approved work outlined in an operating plan or permit.
4. Persons or their invitees who live or own property within the closure area, and permittees who have a legitimate need to access their permitted allotment, escorted or approved by IMT.
5. Persons travelling along Forest Roads 12 and Forest Road 42 from its intersection with Forest Road 12 to the southern boundary of the Ochoco National Forest.
6. Those persons travelling along the closed portions of Oregon State Route 26 when officially escorted or approved by the IMT, and/or Oregon Department of Transportation.

This closure is enacted due to firefighting activities taking place within the closure area, and for the protection of public and employee safety.

This order becomes effective at 2:00 PM, July 19, 2014, and will remain in force until rescinded.

VIOLATION OF THESE PROHIBITIONS IS PUNISHABLE AS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR, BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$5,000 FOR AN INDIVIDUAL OR \$10,000 FOR A LEGAL ENTITY OTHER THAN AN INDIVIDUAL, OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN SIX (6) MONTHS, OR BOTH. TITLE 16 USC, SECTION 551; TITLE 18 USC, SECTION 3551.
