Fire Update - August 15, 2012 9:00 a.m. PDT

This is the final fire update for the Ten Mile Complex. Full containment of the Ten Mile and Banana Lake fires, which make up the Ten Mile Complex, is expected tomorrow. As that occurs, fire suppression resources will move to other fires.

The fires are located east of U.S. Highway 95, and northeast of the town of McDermitt, Nevada on the Nevada/Oregon border. The fires, burning in grass and sage brush, were started by lightning on Friday, August 10th.

Fire suppression activities on this Complex and the Oregon portion of the Holloway Fire are being coordinated by Pacific Northwest Incident Management Team 3, led by Incident Commander Jeff Pendleton.

The term "containment" means that a containment line has been built around the fire perimeter or the fire's edge has been deemed cold and is not expected to move.
