

**ORDER 18-2014-10-17****EMERGENCY CLOSURE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY**
WILLAMETTE NATIONAL FOREST
Middle Fork Ranger District

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited in the area, and on roads and trails described in this order within the Willamette National Forest. This order will become effective upon signature, and will remain in effect until rescinded.

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR §261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- (1) Any person with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.**
- (2) Any Federal, State, or local official or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.**


DESCRIPTION OF AREA:

The order applies to a portion of the Waldo Lake Wilderness west of Waldo Lake and is described by the following landmarks on the Middle Fork Ranger District, in Lane County:

- Beginning at the junction of Forest trails 3590 and 3583, continuing southwest on trail 3583 to the junction of Forest trails 3583 and 3585;
- Continue west on Forest trail 3585 to its junction with Forest trail 3591;
- Continue south to the junction of trails 3591 and 3560;
- Continue south on Forest trail 3560 to its junction with the Waldo Wilderness boundary near the end of Forest Road 2422;
- Continue south along the Waldo Lake wilderness boundary to its junction with Forest trail 3572;
- Continue northeast on Forest trail 3572 to the junction of Forest trails 3572 and 3590;
- Continue due east to the Waldo Lake shoreline;
- Continue north along the Waldo Lake shoreline to the lake's outlet; then continue due west to the junction of Forest trails 3590 and 3583 (starting point).

Violation of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment of not more than six (6) months, or both.
