Unhealthy, Very Unhealthy, or Hazardous
Please Keep Children Indoors and Move Outdoor Activities Out of the Area

Some people may be sensitive to air pollution at the **“Moderate”** level, like people with heart or lung disease, or a current respiratory infection. They should limit outdoor activity.

When air quality is in this range **“Unhealthy for Sensitive Populations”** there is an increasing likelihood of adverse health effects for those with pre-existing heart and lung diseases. People with pre-existing heart and lung diseases, the elderly, and children should limit prolonged outdoor exertion

When the air quality is in the **“Unhealthy”** range there may be increased aggravation of pre-existing heart and lung diseases and premature mortality among sensitive populations. Increasing adverse respiratory effects may also be seen in the general population. People with pre-existing health conditions, the elderly, and children should limit exertion and stay indoors, if possible. Everyone else should limit time spent outdoors and prolonged exertion.
