Order No. 824

FOREST ORDER

Conrad Lake Fire Emergency Road and Trail Closures

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to protect natural resources and provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited with the Naches Ranger District of the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest:

1. Being on National Forest System Roads [NFSR] 1000, 1204, 1205, 1200-725 and being on National Forest System Road 1070 between its junction with NFSR 1000 to its junction with NFSR 1070-595 [36 CFR 261.54 (e)].
2. Being on Bear Creek Mountain Trail #1130 [36 CFR 261.55(a)].

This restriction is effective the date signed below and will remain in effect until rescinded.

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force, in the performance of an official duty.


Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months or both. (16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559 and 3571).

Assessment of Need and Enforcement Plan

1. **Background** – Roads and trails in the vicinity of the Conrad Lake Wildfire are being closed to provide for for public and firefighter health and safety.
2. **Intent of Subpart B Order** – The intent of the order is to eliminate public vehicle travel, camping and other recreational activity in and near the vicinity of the wildfire and suppression activities. The intent of the order is to provide for public and firefighter health and safety. The order shall remain in effect until no longer needed. The affected area includes the National Forest System Roads 1000, 1204, 1205, 1241, and 1070 and Bear Creek Mountain Trail #1130.
3. **Enforcement Plan** – Public notification shall include press releases, web site posts and on-site posting. Guard(s) will be provided on site as needed for education and enforcement.

FOREST ORDER

Conrad Lake Fire Emergency Area Closure

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following act is prohibited on National Forest System (NFS) lands within the Naches Ranger District of the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest as described below and shown on the attached map.

1. **To go into or be upon any area closed for the protection of public health or safety.** For the purpose of this order, it is prohibited to enter or be upon National Forest System lands, roads or trails within the boundary described below and illustrated on the attached map [36 CFR 261.53 (e)].

Closed Area Description: Beginning at a point north and adjacent to the junction of National Forest System Roads [NFSR] 1200 and 1200-711 (Point A: T13N R14E SE ¼ Section 6); then southwesterly on a line parallel and adjacent to the west shoulder of NFSR 1200 to the shoreline of Rimrock Lake (Point B: T13N R14E NW 1/7 Section 7); then generally westerly and northeasterly on a line following the shoreline of Rimrock Lake to Rimrock Lake Dam (Point C: T14N R13E SW ¼ Section 31); then due east to a point on the 3200 foot elevation line below Goose Egg Mountain (Point D: T14N R13E SE ¼ Section 31); then generally southerly and then easterly on a line following the 3200' contour line below Goose Egg Mountain to a point due north of the point of beginning (Point E: T14N R13E SW ¼ Section 6); then on a line heading due south and to the point of beginning.

2. **Being on a road.** For the purpose of this order, it is prohibited to use or be upon any National Forest System Roads inside the closure area, including NFSR 1200-711, 1200-712, 1200-13, 1200-714, 1200-715, 1200-716, 1200-725 and 1200-653 in their entirety [36 CFR 261.54(e)].

This restriction is effective the date signed below and will remain in effect until rescinded.

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.



Assessment of Need and Enforcement Plan

1. **Background** – Management of the Conrad Lake Complex Wildfire will include establishment of an Incident Command Post (ICP) at the popular Rimrock Peninsula Campground and Boat Launch Area. Closure of this popular camping and boating area for the duration of ICP use is warranted to provide for public and firefighter health and safety.
2. **Intent of Subpart B Order** – The intent of the order is to eliminate public vehicle travel, camping and other recreational activity through and at an Incident Command Post for the duration of its use. The intent of the order is to provide for public and firefighter health and safety. The order shall remain in effect until the ICP is no longer needed. The affected area includes the emergency airstrip, campgrounds, boat launch and roads that comprise the “Rimrock Peninsula Recreation Area” (see attached map and description in order).
3. **Enforcement Plan** – Public notification shall include press releases, web site posts and on-site posting. Guard(s) will be provided as necessary on site for the closure duration for education and enforcement.
