



## HAZARDS

- Shallow root systems have burned and standing dead trees (snags) will tumble easily, especially in high winds.
- The fire has burned underground in many areas and may have burned through tree roots. Healthy-looking trees have the potential to fall for no apparent reason.
- **Walking through blackened areas is not safe for anyone, including pets.** White ash may indicate deep pockets of heat where roots and ground vegetation continues to burn below ground level.
- Fire equipment remains in the area. Use caution when driving and keep lights on at all times. Emergency equipment has right of way—expect delays.

## ACTIVE FIRE

- The fire activity continues to be present. **Stay prepared to [re]evacuate if conditions change. You will be notified by law enforcement if this need arises.**
- Flames will be more noticeable at night.
- Firefighters are continuing to locate and extinguish hot spots.

## REPORT to 911

Report anything that is an imminent threat to life or property. Does it appear to be growing in intensity?
