EMERGENCY ROAD CLOSURE
OKANOGAN-WENATCHEE NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited on designated portions of National Forest System (NFS) Lands and Trails of the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest as described below and shown on the attached map:

1. USE BY ANY TYPE OF TRAFFIC ON NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROADS LISTED BELOW AND SHOWN ON EXHIBIT A.

For the purpose of this order, any type of travel is prohibited on the following National Forest Roads due to fire:

- a. Forest Service Road 1601 from the junction of the 232 spur road to the terminus of the 1601, including motorized-use Trail #696 from the 1601 road to the closure point east of Mud Spring. Including all forest roads connecting to the 1601 Road.
- b. Forest Service Road 1500 at east Forest Boundary to the junction of Forest Service Road 1503 and to the terminus of Forest Service Road 1502. Including all forest spur roads connecting to the 1500 and 1502 between referenced points.
[36 CFR 261.54 (b)]

This order is effective beginning at 11:59 p.m. (2359), on September 20, 2015 and will remain in effect until rescinded.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.54(b), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer or member of any organized law enforcement, rescue, or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR 261, Subpart A.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559 and 3571).
